

Congratulations on your new kitten! We are excited to provide exceptional veterinary care for your pet! Below are general guidelines and recommendations from our veterinarians on what to expect on your pet's first visit.

- All initial kitten vaccinations will begin at 8 weeks and will be administered
  every 3-4 weeks until your kitten is at the age of 16 weeks. It is important
  during this stage of your kitten's life to minimize contact with other cats
  and public places until fully vaccinated.
- Please bring all previous medical/vaccination records with you. Please note only treatments/vaccinations done by a licensed veterinarian will be accepted.
- For your kitten's first visit we <u>strongly</u> recommend you bring a fecal sample
  to get it tested for intestinal parasites. Even if your kitten has been
  dewormed, some dewormers do not treat specific parasites. The fecal
  sample has to be <u>no more than 12 hours old</u>, and we just need about a <u>grape</u>
  <u>size amount</u>. It is ok if it has litter on it. You may bring it in a Ziploc bag,
  poop bag or you may request a fecal cup before your appointment day.
- When entering the clinic please have your kitten in a carrier for their own safety as well as the safety of other clients.
- If your kitten is showing any signs of illness such as vomiting, diarrhea or coughing please let us know before arrival so we may prepare accordingly.
- More information regarding vaccinations, flea & heartworm prevention, nutrition, spay/neutering, pet insurance, etc. will be provided/discussed with you at the time of appointment.
- If for some reason you need to reschedule or cancel, please <u>CALL AHEAD</u>
   <u>OF TIME</u> or future appointments may be subjected to a nonrefundable noshow fee.
